Lenten Regulations: The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.



FIRST CLASS RELIC OF BROTHER JAMES MILLER WILL BE DISPLAYED FOR VENERATION!!



Brother James Miller FSC is a Christian Brother who gave his life in service to the marginalized and the poor in Central America. A life cut short, Brother James was only 37 when he was shot and killed by three masked gunmen on Feb. 13, 1982, as he was repairing a wall outside a school in Guatemala, where he served. His cause of martyrdom was undertaken by the Diocese of Huehuetenango in 2009 and received the Decree of Validity in Rome in July 2010 when he was designated a Servant of God and a martyr for the faith. The process leading to his beatification continues with the Congregation of the Causes of Saints in Rome. Born in 1944, James Miller was raised on a farm in Wisconsin where he was taught by the Christian Brothers at Pacelli High School. It was there that he realized he wanted to become a brother, so he left after his freshman year to attend the Juniorate at La Salle Institute, here in Glencoe, Missouri. The Brothers continued to encourage him as he learned what being Lasallian was all about. He was considered "likeable, completely genuine" and also known for his simplicity and hard work. He graduated with a class of 24 young men in June, 1962 and that August, he received his robes to become a Christian Brother. Following his formation years, he taught high school for about 5 years in Minnesota, but yearned for missionary work. A Saint in the Making...A Graduate of La Salle Institute In 1969, after he professed perpetual vows, he answered the call to serve as a missionary in Bluefields, Nicaragua. He taught there until he was assigned to Puerto Cabezas, Nicaragua in 1974. Under his leadership as Director, the school population grew from 300 to 800 students. He also accepted the task of supervising the construction of ten new rural schools. His superiors ordered him to leave Nicaragua in July 1979 during the time of the Sandinista revolution. It was feared that because of his work as a religious, he was at risk. Brother James knew that his time serving in the missions was not done yet, so when an opportunity to serve in Guatemala came up, he was glad to go. He taught at a secondary school in Huehuetenango and worked at the Indian Center where young indigenous Mayans were trained in job skills and leadership skills. There he helped begin an experimental farm where students studied and trained in agriculture. The relations between the Brothers at the Indian Center and the Guatemalan military were often strained. Although students were exempt from military service, the boys from the Center were often rounded up from the street and conscripted into the army. When that happened, a Brother would present proof to the authorities that the boy in question was a student. The military would then reluctantly release him. One such episode occurred just two days before Brother James was murdered. On the afternoon of February 13, 1982, while he was on a ladder repairing a wall at the Indian Center, three hooded men shot Brother James point blank. He died instantly. His death was thought to send a warning to the Brothers to cease interfering in government affairs. Attempts to identify his assassins were unsuccessful. After funeral rites in Guatemala and in St. Paul, Minnesota, he was buried in the parish cemetery in Wisconsin. In one of his last letters before he died, he showed that he was aware of the situation in Guatemala and the possible personal consequences for him. Brother James wrote in January 1982: "I am personally weary of violence, but I continue to feel a strong commitment to the suffering poor of Central America. ... the Church is being persecuted because of its option for the poor. Aware of numerous dangers and difficulties, we continue working with faith and hope and trusting in God's Providence." He went on to write: "I have been a Brother of the Christian Schools for nearly 20 years now, and commitment to my vocation grows steadily stronger in my work in Central America. I pray to God for the grace and strength to serve Him faithfully among the poor and oppressed in Guatemala. I place my life in His Providence. I place my trust in Him." He died one month after writing those words.

Brother James Miller FSC is a Central American Martyr who graduated from La Salle Institute. Bro. James was shot to death on February 13, 1982, in Huehuetenango, Guatemala, while repairing a wall at the De La Salle Indian School. He was very aware of the oppression of the Guatemalan Indian people and worked to provide training in job and leadership skills. He was thought to be martyred over the Brothers' efforts to keep the Indian boys from being conscripted into the military.
