1. Cookbook Account

1. Susanna Lepak – Steak night update

Suzanna and Kent Lepak are coordinators this year. The PCCW is responsible for the coffee, salads, deserts, mushrooms, onions and carry outs. Salad making will be on Friday starting between 7:00 – 7:30 a.m. At noon setting up tables will begin. Audrey Gagas will contact volunteers to set up tables. Karen Klesmith will purchase the food. Suzanna informed the ladies that 14 oz. steaks are being purchased from Country Meats. 400 steaks were ordered. Last year 366 tickets were sold. At the end of the night all steaks were sold.
