Opening Prayer was led by Debbie Adamski, PCCW President

Reports:

1. Reading & approval of March 13, 2023 meeting – Chris Zinda
The minutes were reviewed with the members by Debbie Adamski. Sue Wanta moved for approval. Seconded by Linda Burant. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
2. Financial Report – Judy Wroblewski
St. Ambrose PCCW account - \$43,598.51
St. Ambrose Seminarian account - \$2,164.31
PCCW checking account – March deposits \$240.43, March expenses \$822.29, End of March \$8,644.41
3. Cookbook Account – Betty Kowalski
Balance at end of March - \$12,709.34
4. Communications
A thank you card was read from Karen Klismet for the flowers she received in appreciation for all her effort with the Ponczka fund raiser.

Old Business:

1. There are only 8 people that have paid for the Pilgrimage trip. We have a 56-passenger bus to fill. I will be sending bulletin notices out to St Adalbert's and St. Mary's Immaculate Conception. A notice will be put in other parish bulletins about the Pilgrimage. The payments must be received by April 21. If we do not get 56 people to go on the Pilgrimage, will the money be refunded or will PCCW pay the difference?
Betty Ostrowski moved for an April 21st cut off date and reservations of 52 people or the trip will be canceled. Dorothy Burant seconded. Motion passes unanimously by voice vote.
2. We are still looking for ladies to volunteer to lead the rosary When families have visitation at church before the Funeral Mass if requested.
3. Kitchen Cleaning –
 - I contacted "Sparkling Clean" cleaning service for a quote on cleaning the kitchen in the church hall. I have not received a response from them.
 - Betty Kowalski knows someone that would be willing to clean.
Veronica Bruske provided the guidelines for hiring a Annual/Semi-Annual Deep Clean service or an Ongoing Cleaning service/hire. After reviewing the guidelines no action was taken.
4. Diaper and Wipe Drive
 - from Easter Sunday, April 9, until the May PCCW meeting on May 8
 - Offer to any parishioner that needs them, Operation Bootstrap, Rosholt Pantry
The baskets are in the church for donations.

5. Rosary for the unborn on May 8 at the memorial, weather permitting.
 - There will be two groups, one group will lead the rosary and the other group will respond.
6. Fall fund raiser?
 - Soup Sale – October
 - Homemade crafts and bake sale before Christmas

The members decided to hold the soup sale. There was no discussion on the crafts and bake sale.

7. Has a Bingo been planned? What date? March 3, 2024

New Business:

1. Someone requested to rent our plates for an event. In the past there was a policy issued stating there would not be any borrowing or renting of items from the PCCW kitchen. We do not have a copy of that policy, as all the history has been lost.

The members agreed to not rent items from the PCCW kitchen.

2. Remodel Project

- Previously discussed using PCCW funds to help get the Stations painted in the church.
- The flooring will be the first thing worked on and the pews are not included in the remodel. The pews will have to be physically removed for the flooring to be done, and then reinstalled, at a cost of \$33,000. A storage place for the pews would have to be found, and the cost of the storage added on to the \$33,000. To have the pews strengthened, refinished, and new hardware would be a total of \$92,000 (approx.).
- Would PCCW be willing to offer funds for toward the pew refinishing? What amount?

Information was shared on the pews. No action was taken at this time
